Know Your Bible

Transforming women's lives by the power of God's Word

Insights into Praise and Worship

Prayer is a wonderful gift and privilege from God. In my early Christian life, I think I saw it as asking God for help or thanking him for what he had done for me. How about you?

Prayer can be focused on asking God for what we need to help us with our problems or for other's needs. Of course those are important, but where does praise and worship fit in? Some people are moved by pieces of music, art or poetry. In our church services, we tend to see worship times as singing. Worship is 'worth ship' and God is worthy of praise. As we sing, are we more aware of the tune, the words or the rhythm? Or are we seeing God's worth through the music and words? Do we think about what we are singing? Our school hymn was, 'Praise my soul the King of Heaven'. Looking back, I had no idea what 'praise' really meant. This, like many older hymns, contains biblical truth which point us to God and his attributes. I recall one preacher who said 'Praise is more to do with who God is rather than what he does.' The Lord's prayer begins with, 'Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed (holy, greatly revered and honoured) be your name.' We can praise God because he is holy and deserves to be revered.

When reading Psalm 103 recently, I was struck by the first 5 verses: 'Praise the Lord O my soul; all my inmost being, praise his holy name... and forget not all his benefits.'

Warren Wieresbe says that to praise the Lord means to delight in him – heart, soul, mind and strength. As parents, we often praise our children if they succeed at something but praising God is a much deeper expression of love and gratitude for who he is and what he has done. So, what should we praise God for and not forget?

Firstly, he has forgiven our sins, not just a few, but **all** our sins. Jesus' death, burial and resurrection mean we don't have to bear the guilt and shame of our sins. Praise God for his grace and mercy!

Next, he heals all our diseases. This may seem hard to praise God for, if we are suffering physically. I am conscious that Jesus did not heal everyone who was physically ill when he was on earth. However, God does heal our greatest sickness which is sin, and we can rejoice because there will be no more sin in the new heaven and earth. We can praise God for his gift of salvation to those who trust in Jesus.

Verse 4 tells us that we have been redeemed, bought back with the precious blood of Jesus rather than silver and gold. God loved us enough to send his only son to pay the penalty for our sin. Not only that, but he crowns us with love and compassion. Praise him for his love and compassion towards us, even though he is Lord of Lords and King of Kings, and we should be falling at his feet.

Finally, in verse 5, we are reminded that God has given us so much. He supplies our needs, both physical and spiritual (see Matthew 6:25-33). Of course, we need to be in tune with him and be careful to seek him first. Satisfaction comes when we put God in his rightful place and give him the praise due to his name. Even in old age, we can be strengthened in God and soar like an eagle; maybe not physically, but certainly spiritually.

Perhaps in the coming days, you might like to jot down the things for which you can praise God and share them with others.

Never give up praying!



Earlier in this year I travelled to see my brother, Bob, in Australia. Our mother became a Christian in 1954 after hearing Billy Graham. My brother and I were sent to Sunday School and we were baptised in 1956.

At 18, my brother emigrated to Australia and built a life in which God and all we had learned in Sunday School played little part.

Over the years, when visiting Bob, I encouraged him to consider his spiritual condition, but he was not interested. As time rolled on, my brother required surgery for lung cancer, and towards the end of 2023, he became terminally ill. My husband and I decided to visit Bob and support him in his final weeks, as he had no family members to call on. His wife had died about 16 years ago and his two sons were estranged.

During this time, we talked about the happy days growing up in Southport and the Midlands. I gently brought the conversation around to matters of life and death. Something seemed to stir with Bob and he asked for prayer. I was able to remind him about the thief on the cross who called out to Jesus, 'Lord, remember me'. After a few more days, Bob

said that he had done likewise and called on the Lord. From then on, we were able to talk openly about his approaching departure from this life. He received excellent palliative and nursing care in his own home and died peacefully with a good friend and me at his side.

What do we learn from this?

Clearly, God is at work; the Holy Spirit awakens us at various times and brings to mind things we knew many years ago. The parable of the wayward son of Luke 15 comes to mind.

An added encouragement was that, in the retirement village where Bob lived, there was a KYB group leader. She and her husband were very supportive, and when possible, I joined their KYB study group.

I am so grateful for the medics and good friends in Australia who cared for my brother, and so thankful to God that Bob reached out to the Lord Jesus.

Never give up on praying for your family and friends who are yet to turn to the Lord.

What is CWCI International?

Christian Women Communicating International (CWCI), is the original name of Know Your Bible in the UK and is still used in Australia.

CWCI, based in Australia, produces our KYB study books. They are written, edited and processed by staff and volunteers, mainly based in Australia, although writers could come from New Zealand or the UK. The staff and volunteers work under the management and leadership of the International Board of CWCI.

You may ask who is on this board? For the first time, the IB President, Sandra Gilbert, is from the UK, and was formerly President of KYB in the UK. The presidents of the three national boards also attend: Tina Stevens from the UK, Sue Reeve from New Zealand and Chris Keith from Australia. These ladies are involved in all discussions and decisions the board makes. The Board also has a Prayer Director, Finance Director, KYB Director and Secretary. Each member of the board serves for three years, with three more by mutual agreement. The KYB Production Director and Finance Director are able to do a further three years.

Before the pandemic, the board met in person twice a year, with the UK attending once a year because of the distance. However, the board now meets by Zoom at least six times a year. For the UK, the meetings start at either 6.30 or 7am allowing Australia and New Zealand to attend at a reasonable time at the other end of their day! Last year (2023) IB met in person in Sydney, Australia. It was such a joy to have meetings, fellowship, discussion and prayer face-to-face. We were also able



to invite our staff and volunteers for a get-together either in person or by zoom



Producing four study books a year, with the associated costs, is approx. £46-£52,000. Some of this money is made up of gifts but the majority is raised through each of the three countries giving 10% of the sale price of each book and 10% of any other money they receive. In Australia, there are over 1,300 groups who do 4 studies a year and without their money, CWCI would not be able to produce the study books.

In the past, CWCI has been responsible for translating the studies into a number of different languages and many people have benefitted. This has not been sustainable, due to a lack of teams in the countries to continue the work. CWCI is exploring new ways to develop the work using indigenous people in the country. Increasingly, there are requests for Easy English studies which can be used for translation or where English is a second language.

The International Board plan to meet a year early in person, in the Autumn of 2025, which will enable the UK International President and Finance Director to hand over to those taking on those jobs.

It was a privilege to be amongst so many individuals and ministries which are passionately engaging with Scripture.

We're praying that the seeds sown land in fertile soil and bear fruit.

Hebrews: Hearing God's Voice

I have enjoyed being in a KYB small group, with the nine of us getting to know each other and the Lord better, and have recently finished the book of Hebrews.

God has always spoken to his people, through his prophets long ago, but now we are able to hear his voice for ourselves which is amazing. God wants us to pursue a personal relationship with him through his son Jesus, who radiates the glory of God and expresses the very character of God.

It is a wonderful privilege to enter into the very presence of God, because of what Jesus has done for us; there are now no barriers between us. I love the song Art of Celebration: 'Boldly I approach your throne, blameless now I'm running home; by your blood I come, welcomed as your own, into the arms of Majesty ... knowing that we are free from condemnation ... so praise the One who made an end to all our sin.' These words say it all.

Within that personal relationship with God, he wants us to live a life of faith, and sometimes it's tested. In

2016 I had such a test, with a diagnosis of bladder cancer, but God is faithful.

At a hospital appointment, I had a male nurse with a name badge of MEL: I was inquisitive and asked was it short for something; the answer was, to my amazement and joy, Melchizedek – he was a Christian! Of course he was. God had sent someone with the name that meant 'King of Kings, King of Peace, King of Righteousness', to reassure and look after me. All was well.

When studying Hebrews, we had lots of discussion about who Melchizedek was, and how he points us to Jesus.

To finish, let us be those who remember to love one another, who remember what God has done in the past, and encourage others to keep their eyes on Jesus, the Author and Perfector of our faith.
