

Immeasurably More in 2026

My nine-year-old grandson is determined to have a six-pack. He works on it diligently (between football and whatever else currently counts as important boy business). He is quite sure he can already see results. Naturally, his four-year-old cousin now wants a six-pack, too.

As for me, I've made peace with the fact that the body of my dreams may be out of reach. At my age, it feels unlikely. Maybe you feel the same about one dream or another. What I haven't given up on, though, is asking God for things. That's one of the reasons I chose Ephesians 3:20 as our KYB verse of the year:

'Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us...'

Paul, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, really piles on the language here. Commentators say he uses something like a "super-superlative"—as if ordinary words just aren't enough. We might say: very, extremely, extraordinarily abundant.

I need that reminder regularly. It's so easy for me to focus on what's happening around me, on what I can manage or fix in my own strength—which, if I'm honest, is very little. When I do that, my prayers shrink to match my perspective. But this verse lifts my eyes and reminds me that God is already at work and that He delights in doing far more than I would ever think to ask.

When I became God's child, I entered into a partnership with Him. I forget

that sometimes. Ephesians 3:20 calls me back to that truth.

I love how The Passion Translation puts it:

'Never doubt God's mighty power to work in you and accomplish all this. He will achieve infinitely more than your greatest request, your most unbelievable dream, and exceed your wildest imagination.'


As the National Leadership Team of KYB, we long to hear stories this year of new groups starting—both in places where KYB already exists and in areas where there are none at the moment. It's a big dream. On some days it feels unrealistic. But then I remember: God doesn't work within the limits of our age, our energy, or our imagination. He works with power — his power — within us. Our part is not to achieve the impossible, but to take the next faithful step and trust him to do what only He can do. What might that step look like for you?

My grandsons may or may not ever achieve the six-packs of their dreams. But when it comes to God's purposes, I don't want to limit what I ask for or expect. Ephesians 3:20 reminds me that God is able to do immeasurably more than all I ask or imagine — and that is a hope far better than any six-pack.

To Jesus be all the glory (Ephesians 3:21).

Walking in the garden in the cool of the day

As we look at the news the world seems to be in an awful mess, and it can seem all doom and gloom. I have now listened to Tricia Marnham speak on 'Hope Abounding' three times and have been struck every time by a quote from John Hindley's book, 'Dealing with Disappointment': ***'We were not made for this world. We were not created for a world of sin and death. We were created to walk with God in the cool of the day.'***

Isn't it reassuring to remember that this world is not all there is, that the best is yet to come? But let's go back to Genesis 3:8. Adam and Eve have disobeyed God; they are afraid and have hidden from him. Imagine this garden – a beautiful place that God has created for his people, no weeds, nothing out of place, full of beauty and the scents of nature. For me there has to be running water and a waterfall too! Now, remember back to those steamy, hot summer days and the beautiful cool of the evening when the sun is going down. Next, imagine God appearing at this time every day to enjoy it with you. It

seems ***'The Lord God walking in the garden in the cool of the day'***, was a regular occurrence because Adam and Eve recognised the sound of God walking there.

What happens when you walk with someone? It is a beautiful day - you take in the wonderful sights and smells all around you. As you walk, talk, laugh, listen and share your hearts, your attention is focused on the person you are with. You notice the beauty around you or an occasional distraction (a squirrel or a kingfisher, maybe) and share it with your companion. God intended to have this kind of companionship with the people he created.

Leviticus 26:12: ***'I will walk among you and be your God, and you will be my people.'*** This verse is quoted by Paul in 2 Corinthians 6:16. God's desire is to walk among his people; however, that relationship was marred by sin. The requirement for that privilege of ***'walking in the garden in the cool of the day,'*** is living as he requires - Deuteronomy 10:12-13. To walk with God is to be obedient to his commands and

decrees, to live as he wants us to live.

This comes through in the New Testament too. My Wednesday KYB group have recently read Ephesians 2:10 (Amp) ***'For we are his workmanship [his own master work, a work of art], created in Christ Jesus [reborn from above – spiritually transformed, renewed, ready to be used] for good works, which God prepared [for us] beforehand [taking paths which he set], so that we would walk in them [living the good life which he prearranged and made ready for us].'***

In our church we have been following a series in Colossians and Paul again refers to walking with God and living for him - Colossians 2:16 (Amp) ***'Therefore as you have received Christ Jesus as Lord, walk in [union with] him [reflecting his character in the things you do and say – living lives that lead others away from sin].'***

Walking is modelled by God: it's a step-by-step process of moving from where you are now to where you ought to be. We walk one step at a time. Walking is not an activity for the select few – it is God's desire for all his children. God longs for us to walk with him. God created us for the enjoyment of an ongoing relationship that involves companionship, intimacy, joint decision-making and mutual delight. It means moving forward

in obedience, even when the way ahead is uncertain.

1 John 2:5-6 ***'But if anyone obeys his word, God's love is truly made complete in him. This is how we know we are in him: Whoever claims to live in him must walk as Jesus did.'***

New Shoots

Every Springtime, new growth is vibrant, encouraging and wonderful to see. Here are some encouraging signs of new growth in KYB.

I have been aware of KYB/CWCI since living in Australia 50 years ago! I have been receiving the UK Newslink for some time and was keen to introduce KYB to my church Bible Club. Somehow the timing was never quite right. However, in early December 2025 I returned to Leeds from an extended visit to my sister in Australia. Whilst there I enjoyed visiting a local KYB group and brought back some 'completed' study books. After seeing the books and hearing about the KYB method of study, we agreed to give Galatians a try, which we began in mid-January. We started gently by reading the introduction and completing Day 1 together, and everyone was keen to continue at home, ready for our next session!

To give you the context, our church is on a deprived housing estate in Leeds, with believers from many different backgrounds. We are keen to welcome everyone, whether new believers, seekers, or those just looking for a community to be part of. The Bible Club was established to provide a mid-week opportunity for those who came on Sunday to learn more about faith in Jesus. The name Bible Club was chosen to express a sense of belonging and for many the idea of studying is alien and fearful. In the past we have used a variety of materials, and I am praying that God will bless our personal study and our times of sharing together using KYB.

When I was invited to join KYB, I wasn't sure how much I could contribute to the group as I had only become a Christian 14 months earlier at the age of 65! My baptism buddy is also a member. But the welcome I received and the way the group encourages and supports your walk with Jesus, I knew I would be back.



After the first session, where I just listened, the way reading the Bible in a group expands and reveals so many layers became apparent. The last study - Five Lives - was amazing. To think that God used ordinary women to create extraordinary outcomes. It looked at how God worked in and through their lives. We couldn't find an online Bible study group that ran on a day that I was free, so we decided to start an evening online meeting on Thursdays from 7.00 - 8.30pm, starting with Ancient Prayers for Modern People. We are now looking at Ephesians together and would welcome any other ladies who would like to join us.



Hi, I'm **Nicky Dixon** and live in Mid Wales. When Michelle got in touch via the KYB website, we were disappointed not to be able to find an online group for her, so that's why we started meeting up, on Zoom at first and now on WhatsApp. We take turns to lead the discussion, read the Scripture verses and share our different comments and answers. We pray together and share news, just like other groups. What a blessing! (nickydixon18@gmail.com if you'd like to join us!)

I knew nothing about KYB before I was invited to join Clevedon's first group; ladies from four different local churches, meeting in person each week. It wasn't long until I was hooked! The well-crafted study books make meeting together to study God's Word a joy. Each study guides us gently to share our thoughts and learn God's ways. Whichever study we do, the readings and questions draw us in, they feed a desire to know and understand more of God's will. We are learning more about being a disciple of Jesus. We have been meeting for 2 years now, and through the five studies that we have completed we have found a growing understanding that the whole Bible is about Jesus.

The other Clevedon group are all from the same church. They wanted to start with the tough stuff! They went straight to the KYB Revelation study. For many that could be too daunting, not for these ladies. They are loving it. One, a 70-year-old, announced that she is going to read every book; Genesis to Revelation. What an encouragement!



New Things – in the past 12 months at least 12 new groups have started using KYB study guides. This is very exciting and means that there are around 150 KYB groups across the UK! There has also been a marked increase in Bible sales - what a great time to be encouraging others to discover more from God's Word in a KYB group.

I hope that you visit our website regularly and have discovered the offer of £2 per copy on some titles, with a group offer of 6 study books plus a leader's guide for £10. Do you know of any folk that you could encourage to start looking at the Bible together by giving them one of these bundles?

At the end of 2025 we published **1 and 2 Thessalonians: Waiting Faithfully**. Janet Crawshaw, the writer of these studies, says, 'Most of us wonder what the future will bring. The letters to the Thessalonians reveal a multicultural church who wanted to understand and deepen their faith. I've wondered what life was like for them. Did these biblical letters help them to face their present circumstances as well as the future? What did the letters reveal about the writer and his message? Can I find something in them which will help me live today?'

Coming soon will be **Ecclesiastes: Wrestling with Life**. Jennie Baddeley, writer of these studies, says '... this book is so good for us as followers of Jesus. Ecclesiastes makes us wise by teaching us to slow down and think difficult thoughts about our broken world in the presence of God and with each other. ... life is complicated and frustrating sometimes, but God is already there before we've even thought of those questions and doubts. He gives us words and ways of thinking to guide us through ... Ecclesiastes is the book we need when we realise that this life is not all that we would want it to be. It is God's gift to us.'

Do you have bookkeeping or accountancy skills?

I have enjoyed serving on the National Leadership Team for the past five years, but I now need to hand over the reins to someone else. I update the accounts monthly, bank any cheques received (most people are now able to pay online), make online payments for any purchases etc., and provide quarterly accounts to the NLT and trustees. I also prepare the year end accounts (we can use the cash basis) for the independent examiner to approve. I am then responsible for submitting the figures/accounts to the Charity Commission, which is done online. The time required to carry out the tasks varies but is around one or two days a month (not necessarily in one sitting).

KYB pays for online accounting software, which has proved easy to use and I am very happy to provide support/training to whoever takes over the role.
