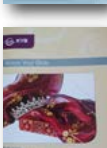

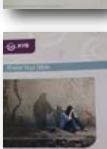

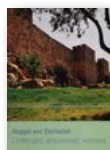

Full of Hope in Southport

On 9th May Southport KYB groups hosted a day event on the theme of '**Hope Fulfilled**'. 45 ladies met together for a wonderful day of worship, fellowship and teaching with our speaker Sandra Gilbert.

Sandra led us through the scriptures from Genesis to Revelation giving us a helicopter view, zooming in on Jesus' teaching in the Gospels and the Letters to the early church and ending with Revelation 21, the new heavens and new earth.

Using our imagination, we considered what the new heavens and earth and our new bodies would be like when 'all things are made new'.

We asked what happens when we die? What is 'paradise'? What is 'heaven'? what is meant by 'Jesus being the first fruits?'

We explored the **hope** we have in Christ, so that we are equipped and ready to share with anyone who asks *the reason for our hope in Jesus*. A **hope** - not just for this life - but for eternity! The Holy Spirit within us *now* is the deposit; our guarantee of what is to come, and the promise that we will be *with him forever*. With *new resurrection bodies*...the dead in Christ will rise and believers who are still alive will be caught up together to meet the Lord in the air...and we will be with the Lord forever. (1Thessalonians 5:13-17)



We *are* living in uncertain times, in a changing world, swimming against the tide. Rather than being shaped by the world, we are to be 'transformed by the renewing of our minds' and to be shining lights in a dark world.



Sandra challenged the phrase 'too heavenly minded to be any earthly use'. Viewing life from God's perspective, will *transform the way we live*, as we see despair and darkness giving way to HOPE. God has work for us to do - here and now - that we won't have the opportunity to do once we die.

Now is the time to work with Him to bring this hope to our world.

The praise and worship during the day, brought a real sense of awe and wonder, joy and thanks for the glorious hope we have and for all God's promises revealed to us through His Word.

The beginning of KYB UK – a daughter's perspective!



In 1977 as a rebellious teenager of 17, I flew with my parents, Sid and Eunice Bewsey, to meet our relatives in Melbourne, Australia. My aunt and uncle had left the UK as 'Ten-pound poms' in the 50s and we hadn't seen them since.

We stayed with my aunt, and I hung out with my cousin most of the time. At the time I'd just completed a medical secretarial diploma, had discarded my Christian faith, and was leading a very worldly life. My parents hoped a trip overseas would encourage me to see sense.

I really don't know what happened as I showed no interest, but my mother returned home all fired up by something called 'CWCI'. She'd attended a conference with my aunt and met Jean Raddon, the founder of CWCI, and others on the International Board and felt led to begin a similar ministry in the UK.

From those initial meetings she met Lynn Green in Scotland, and they worked together to introduce CWCI and KYB in the UK grew.

Fast forward 5 years, I'd recommitted my life to the Lord and married a wonderful Christian man.

Meanwhile, my parents' home became the hub of UK administration for KYB resources. Their study became the office, cupboards were used to store Bible study resources, ready for dispatch. They

hosted meetings for Trustees and Management Board regularly and at times, their house seemed more like a B&B with their various guests coming and going.

If I visited on a Monday morning, I could hear mum working in the office with her two friends, June and Margaret. They obviously enjoyed their team work and CWCI grew into the KYB organisation it is today.

I write this now to give tribute to those three faithful, godly women - my mother Eunice, Margaret Walton and June Dodson - who have all now gone to glory. They leave the heritage that you read about in this publication. Their daughters are my dear friends who I treasure and often look to for love, support and guidance in my life.

My mother Eunice was hugely impacted by severe rheumatoid arthritis but didn't allow it to define her or stand in her way. Working together with June and Margaret, they were just 'ordinary' women, faithfully using their skills to glorify God.

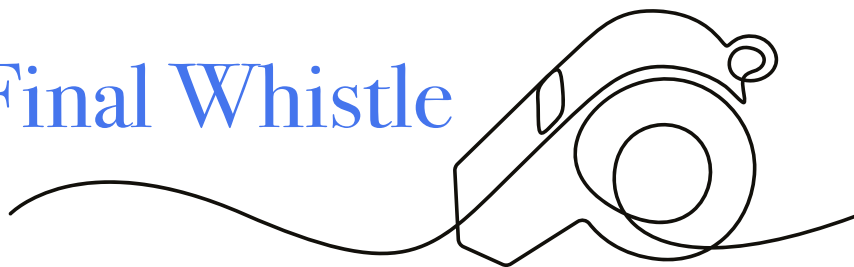
As you read this, I hope it will encourage you to heed the calling the Lord may place on your heart, to use your gifts to encourage others to know Christ and make him known.

By the time you read this, the World Cup will be over. The celebrations will have faded, the disappointments will have softened, and the endless analysis will have moved on. Yet for a few weeks, millions of people were captivated by one question: How will it end?

My husband planned to stay up to watch England's match against Mexico live (helped by an afternoon nap!). When storms delayed the kick-off by an hour, he reluctantly gave up and went to bed. The following morning, he carefully avoided every news report so he could enjoy watching without knowing the result.

I took a different approach. I checked the score as soon as I woke. I knew England had won. I knew who had scored and when, and so was able to relax and enjoy the match. I knew the outcome.

As followers of Christ, we live with something of that same tension. We

don't know what tomorrow or next week will bring. Life often holds surprises, disappointments and heartache, but God has already revealed the final outcome.

In Revelation 21:3-4, John hears the wonderful promise: 'Look! God's dwelling place is now among the people, and he will dwell with them.'. Then comes the amazing assurance that 'He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away.'

Knowing the ending doesn't remove today's challenges or spare us from tears and uncertainty. But it does fill us with hope. Whatever happens, we know that Jesus has the final victory. We can live today with confidence, persevere through hard times, and look to the future with joyful expectation because we know how the story ends. The final whistle has not yet blown, but the result is certain—and that changes everything.
